Dear President Trump:

As members of the Democratic Women's Caucus, we write with grave concern about your plans to fire thousands of federal employees at the Social Security Administration (SSA). Removing SSA staff would harm families across the United States, and disproportionately impact women, who are the majority of Social Security beneficiaries.¹ We demand that you retain all SSA employees and do not place any SSA employees on administrative leave. Additionally, we demand you reinstate those who have already been impacted.

Your proposed cuts to Social Security Administration staff will jeopardize the economic security of millions of women. In 2023, women constituted 55% of adult Social Security beneficiaries and 63% of beneficiaries 85 and older.² Additionally, 95% of Social Security survivor benefits are for women as they are more likely to outlive their spouses.³ As a result, women will have to decide whether to pay rent or buy food because of a stalling of services at SSA due to staff shortages and an upheaval of internal systems. You have also claimed that there is "widespread fraud" across SSA with millions of

beneficiaries being over 100 years old, which has been debunked.⁴ Women and families should not pay the price for your lies and for billionaires to cash out.

You have also repeatedly remarked that you will not cut Social Security payments. Yet, you plan to fire 7,000 employees and shut down at least 48 SSA offices across the country.⁵ If there are not enough staff to administer the benefits, that is the equivalent of cutting payments. Particularly, staff is needed to issue reimbursements for 2.5 million beneficiaries based on the *Social Security Fairness Act* (Public Law 118-273), which President Joe Biden signed into law on January 5, 2025.⁶ Reducing staff at SSA would delay these payments for seniors and survivors, who are predominantly women. SSA already has a shortage of workers that leads to long wait times for beneficiaries. In fact, in Texas, individuals with disabilities must wait on average 332 days for SSA to process their disability claims. In Georgia, wait times average 370 days.⁷ Women and families cannot afford to wait over a year to access their benefits.

We demand that you reinstate and retain federal employees at the Social Security Administration. Without these employees, women who rely on Social Security payments will suffer through no fault of their own. We look forward to your response.
