FEMA Pre-Disaster Mitigation Grants
Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC)

Program Description

The BRIC program supports states, local communities, tribes and territories as they undertake hazard mitigation projects, reducing the risks they face from disasters and natural hazards. Funds are used for the following purposes:

- **Capability- and Capacity-Building Activities:** Enhances the knowledge, skills, expertise, etc., of the current workforce to expand or improve the administration of mitigation assistance. This includes activities, such as building codes activities, partnerships, project scoping, mitigation planning and planning-related activities, and other activities.
- **Mitigation Projects:** Cost-effective projects designed to increase resilience and public safety, reduce injuries and loss of life, and reduce damage and destruction to property, critical services, facilities, and infrastructure.
- **Management Costs:** Financial assistance to reimburse the Recipient for eligible and reasonable indirect costs, direct administrative costs, and other administrative expenses associated with a specific mitigation measure or project in an amount up to 15 percent of the total amount of the grant award, of which not more than 10 percent of the total award amount may be used by the Recipient and 5 percent by the subrecipient for such costs.
- **Non-financial Direct Technical Assistance:** Builds community capacity and capability to improve its resiliency to natural hazards and to ensure stakeholders are capable of building and sustaining successful mitigation programs, submitting high-quality applications, and implementing new and innovative projects that reduce risk from a wide range of natural hazards.

General Guidance for Community Project Funding Requests for BRIC Funds:

Only projects that meet the requirements detailed in the most recent [Notice of Funding Opportunity](#) (NOFO) for the BRIC grant program will be considered for funding, including the cost-share requirement and environmental and historic preservation requirements, as applicable.

All project proposals must be accompanied by a letter of support from the appropriate state agency affirming that it believes the project is eligible.

Nonprofit Security Grant Program (NSGP)

Program Description

The NSGP will provide funding support for target hardening and other physical security enhancements and activities to nonprofit organizations that are at high risk of terrorist attack. The intent is to integrate nonprofit preparedness activities with broader state and local preparedness efforts. It is also designed to promote coordination and collaboration in emergency preparedness activities among public and private community representatives, as well as state and local government agencies.

Only projects that meet the requirements detailed in the most recent [Notice of Funding Opportunity](#) (NOFO) and the [Preparedness Grants Manual](#) (PGM) for the NSGP will be considered for funding.

For any projects designated for funding in the final fiscal year 2022 Homeland Security Appropriations Act, the respective state administrative agency (SAA) must submit an application to the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), and the SAA will serve as the administrative agent for the grant. Therefore, all project proposals must be accompanied by a letter of support from the appropriate SAA affirming that it believes the project is eligible.

The EOC Grant Program improves emergency management and preparedness capabilities by supporting flexible, sustainable, secure, strategically located, and fully interoperable EOCs with a focus on addressing identified deficiencies and needs. Fully capable emergency operations facilities at the state and local levels are an essential element of a comprehensive national emergency management system and are necessary to ensure continuity of operations and continuity of government in major disasters or emergencies caused by any hazard.
